which establishes the annual assessment in each of the Districts, must be updated annually and approved by the Town Council following a public hearing.

Mayor Pro Tem Abel inquired if there is a vote on the districts required after Council action. Deputy Town Manager Stueckle explained the process of assessment district formation and subsequent annual review.

**18. Animal Care & Control Presentation & Report**

Animal Care and Control Manager Smith presented an overview of services for the past 12 months.

Mayor Drozd opened public comments. With no members of the public wishing to speak, public comments were closed.

Mayor Pro Tem Abel thanked Smith for the presentation and commented on a recent need for animal control services. Abel inquired on adoption procedures during the COVID-19 health crisis, commented favorably on the amazing facility, and thanked the Animal Care and Control staff.

Council Member Denison explained his past experiences with the local music program and commented on current challenges.

Bill Barrett, Music Director for Yucca Valley High School commented on programming challenges with students during the pandemic.

Mayor Pro Tem Abel explained the need to support music programs to supplement the student's educational experience. Abel thanked the Music Booster volunteers.

Shawn Moon, spoke on behalf of the Boys and Girls Club, thanking the Town Council for the support and explained the services currently being offered to the youth of the community.

Council Member Lombardo, thanked Moon for the excellent job.

Mayor Drozd opened public comments. With no members of the public wishing to speak, public comments were closed.

Mayor Pro Tem Abel expressed he had questions for the Hi-Desert Dance Team and was hoping they were in attendance and noted his appreciation to the other organizations for the services to the public.

Mayor Drozd requested a 5 minute recess at 7:50 PM. Meeting resumed at 7:55 PM.

Finance and Accounting Supervisor Gumbish presented the staff report for the proposed FY 2020-21 budget.

Mayor Drozd opened public comments.

Sarann Graham, Yucca Valley expressed she is pleased with the budget and thankful that the public safety budget was not cut. Graham thanked the Town Council for approving the use of Measure Y funds to assist the community's small businesses.

Nicholas Christensen, business owner in Yucca Valley spoke of concern of funding the public safety budget with all what is happening right now; funding should be reduced and invested in proactive community programs instead.

Craig Hoelzel, Yucca Valley welcomed Lt. Walker and spoke in support of local law enforcement and thanked the Council for not de-funding public safety.

\_\_\_\_\_ (no name given) spoke of concern with the Town Council's stance on the impending decision to list the Western Joshua Tree as endangered,

Town Clerk Copeland reported that five comments were received via email prior to the meeting in support of local law enforcement and opposing any budget reductions for public safety.

Mayor Pro Tem Abel thanked Christensen for his comments and explained the Town contracts with San Bernardino County. Abel thanked staff for tightening the belt to get through this challenging time.

Council Member Denison thanked Gumbish for the presentation and thanked Town staff for their teamwork and being efficient with the use of funds while keeping services high. Denison thanked the community for their support for Measure Y as its making a difference in the community.

Council Member Schooler thanked Gumbish and Yakimow for the smooth budget process, and for the availability of Measure Y funds to assist the community during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Council Member Lombardo agreed with previous council member comments, and thanked staff for adapting during the COVID-19 pandemic. Lombardo expressed he would like to go back to a 2-year budget in the future but understands the uncertainty right now.

Mayor Drozd thanked the dedicated Town staff, Town commissioners and Council.

Mayor Drozd opened public comments for items not on the agenda.

Ernesto Nevaraz, Morongo Valley spoke on the impending vote of placing the Western Joshua Tree on the endangered species list and requested public accountability in policing.

Nicholas Christensen, a local business owner, asked Council to research and dig deeper on excessive police force as many local people do not agree with current public comment.

Surann Graham, Yucca Valley spoke on behalf of Hi-Desert Water District and updated the Council on current connections to the sewer system.

Town Clerk Copeland read comments into the record by Becky Vowles, Pioneertown, and Diane Lawrence, Yucca Valley supporting local law enforcement.

**STAFF REPORTS AND COMMENTS**

Community Services Earnest commented on the modified summer recreation programming.

Deputy Town Manager Stueckle updated the Council on the timing for the request for proposal on the Yucca Trail project and commented on calling animal control for the removal of snakes. Stueckle reminded the public to contact Town Hall if there is a need or concern in the community and spoke of the Town's street sweeping services.
